

Josh McDowell writes 'An executive 'head hunter' who goes out and hires corporate executives for other firms once told me, 'When I get an executive I'm trying to hire for someone else, I like to disarm him. I offer him a drink, take my coat off, then my vest, undo my tie, throw up my feet and talk about baseball, football, family, whatever, until he's all relaxed. Then when I think I've got him relaxed I lean over, look him square in the eye and say-what's the purpose in your life?' It's amazing how top executives fall apart on that question.' Well, I was interviewing this fellow the other day, had him all disarmed with my feet up on my desk talking about football. Then I leaned over and said -what's the purpose in your life, Bob? Without blinking an eye he said to go to heaven and take as many people with me as I can.' For the first time in my career I was speechless.'

There are basically five reasons why we don't share our faith more often, and not one of them will hold up when we stand before Christ:

- 1) We think it's the preacher's job
- 2) We aren't sure of our salvation
- 3) We fear being rejected
- 4) We've never taken responsibility for learning how
- 5) Our love for Christ has grown cold.

But not Paul: he said, '...whatever a person is like, I try to find common ground with him so that he will let me tell him about Christ and let Christ save him'. Can you say that?

1912 Gilbert Dibble 2007

We give thanks for and celebrate the life of Gilbert Ruskin Frost Dibble a great village character, the longest serving member in any of the Link Churches, a much loved friend and a man of quiet devotion and confident faith .Gilbert's family moved to Brent Knoll, from East Brent, when he and his twin brother Austin were two years old and Gilbert has been part of the life of the Methodist Church here ever since The monthly letter from Brent Knoll gives some indication of how much we shall miss his cheery presence, always accompanied by flowers from his garden and, in season, fruit from his orchard .At the Harvest Season Gilbert came into his own, boxes of apples , including Annie Elizabeth and the famous Tom Putts, appeared in abundance and when he took over as auctioneer for the sale of produce he had his own unique style ! Bids soared and sweet items might be knocked down suddenly to the familiar words "I'll have ee"! For the past 15 or 16 years Gilbert has also enjoyed being Father Christmas for our Toddlers Group. The first year he did this he still had his tractor and you can imagine the delight of the little boys when he arrived on that. But it is as a faithful Church Steward that he will be especially missed. For many years he served with Roland Chivers, who, in stature towered over Gilbert and always took the lead in looking after the preacher and offering prayers in the vestry but when he became ill Gilbert stepped into his place with no fuss and it has been a great gift to anyone who came to lead a service just to have him there .He would have been greeting people, sometimes whistling away, not always realising that he could be heard throughout the church ,- his refusal to have a deaf-aid did cause some difficulties as well as much amusement - and then he would step into the vestry to pray in his own quiet and sincere way for the needs of the world ,which he was aware of throughout the week , and for the service and the preacher. He would usually begin by quoting a verse from a hymn and one of his favourites was "O worship the Lord in the beauty of holiness". Words are always inadequate to express our appreciation of someone we have loved but I can hear Gilbert saying to me now, as he did in our last conversation "Don't you worry about me my dear. I shall be all right" .We rejoice that he has passed quietly and peacefully into the hands of God, in whom he put his trust and all is well.
