

Minister's Letter

Dear Friends,

There is such a lot going on this month! June contains our celebrations of Pentecost; June confronts us once more with the concept of Trinity; June is Bible Month; June is sabbatical.

At Pentecost, the Holy Spirit was poured out upon disciples and those who heard their message. Although Jesus had breathed the Holy Spirit on the disciples when he first appeared to them after his resurrection (John 20: 22) the account of Pentecost in Acts 2 is universally accepted within Christianity as the time when its full power was unleashed into the lives of hesitant and uncertain Galileans. It was as if they were suddenly plugged into God in a new way.

Trinitarian doctrine was developed to try to explain people's experience of God. Because it is a human idea trying to make sense of an infinite God, it is one that has tested the minds of great theologians across the centuries. So, if you don't fully understand it – don't worry! If you do **fully** understand it – come and explain it to me. The important matter to understand is that speaking of the Trinity does not speak of 3 God's; it is one God, who is Father, Son and Holy Spirit, and we encounter God in these different ways, as Creator, Saviour and Spirit.

Those of you who remember the last two Bible Months in 2017 & 2018 will remember the Book of James, and our study of Jonah. This is a month when we invite churches and groups to engage directly with scripture through focusing on one book of the Bible. This year we will be studying the letter to the **Colossians.** With the exception of Pentecost Sunday, preachers in our circuit have been asked to lead services in June based on Paul's words to this small church in Asia Minor, to help us understand how we encounter the God of creation, salvation and Spirit within the church today.

At the same time both Rev. Angie and Deacon Gary are both enjoying (hopefully) a time of rest and restoration, study and personal development, as they undertake their sabbaticals. We hold them in our prayers and ask God to give them new insights and a renewed purpose. We look forward to the way in which God will use these things when they return to minister amongst us again.

Although this month will be a busy one, there is much to inspire us and to lift us up.
